In this reference I would like to share our impressions and experiences with Cyndi Rickards, also on behalf of my immediate colleagues Marco Hofman and Annekee van Bemmel.

Since summer 2020 we have been working with Cyndi in a collaborative online international learning (COIL) project on social justice. We got to know her as a decisive, pragmatic, socially involved, enthusiastic and hospitable person.
